To maintain AS9100 certification, the certifying agency, Intertek, will be performing an onsite surveillance audit December $19^{th} - 21^{st}$. The purpose of the audit is to validate that our processes and procedures are compliant with the AS9100 standards.

It is important to know that it is **not a test**, auditors are not looking for an exact answer, rather they want to know how employees go about finding information and answers. Do procedures provide information? If the information is not in a procedure, where does the employee go next, do they ask a supervisor?

Able Holiday Reminders

For <u>Thanksgiving week</u>, we will be OPEN Monday, November 20th through Wednesday, November 22nd. We will be closed for Thanksgiving and the Day after Thanksgiving, November 23rd and 24th. Employees can return to work on Monday, November 27th.

Any employees who wish to work the week of Thanksgiving must notify their supervisors in advance and will be required to work Monday- Wednesday.

For <u>Christmas</u> and <u>New Years</u> break, we will be closed Monday, December 25th thru Monday, January 1st. Employees can return to work on Tuesday, January 2nd.

The following holidays are paid holidays for all qualifying employees:

Thanksgiving Day Day after Thanksgiving Day Christmas Day New Years Day

Time off during these breaks, other than the holidays listed above, can be taken as PTO or unpaid. Unless notified otherwise, available PTO will be applied first.
