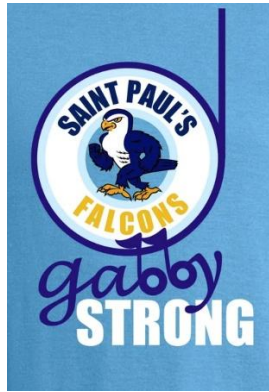

As many staff members know, on December 12, 2024, Kimberly Rockefellers' niece, Gabby, suffered a severe brain bleed and was rushed to Johns' Hopkins Hospital, where she underwent life saving measures. She was in the ICU for weeks in a medically induced coma.

Gabby celebrated her 14th birthday on December 18th while in the hospital. At the time the doctors did not know the extent of the damage to her brain and if she would ever be able to leave the hospital and live a normal life.

In January, Gabby moved to an Inpatient Rehabilitation Hospital that is a part of Johns Hopkins, called the Kennedy Krieger Institute. At Kennedy Krieger, Gabby worked with an incredible team of doctors, nurses and therapists to start to learn how to walk, talk, eat and be a teenager again!

We are happy to report that on March 12th, Gabby went home after 91 days in the hospital! Even more amazing is, she returned to school on March 26th! Her doctors believe that she will be able to graduate with her 8th grade class and go to 9th grade next year. This is truly a miracle!

Through every therapy session, Gabby continues to shine with her bright smile and unwavering spirit. Every day the medical professionals continue to be astounded by her progress. We are so proud of how far she has come in such a short period of time. In fact, Johns Hopkins Magazine will feature Gabby in a cover story on the impact of Music Therapy in patient care, as music has played a huge part in her recovery and healing.

Thank you everyone for your support and prayers for our precious Gabby during this difficult time. We felt every one of them and truly believe that the prayers for Gabby are what caused these wonderful miracles to happen. Please continue to pray for Gabby and her family. She is truly a child of God and inspiration everyone around her.
